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A Message from Dr. Rossman, Principal

The school year is halfway over, students have completed midterms and report cards are posted on Infinite Campus. Please log in and check your child's report card and attendance. It is accessible 24 hours a day for your convenience. If you need further information on how to access this information, please call Michele Finlay at 650-8232 for assistance.

Students have registered for courses for next year. Discuss with your child course offerings. It is our expectation that students will sign up for rigorous courses that interest them. Students in grades nine through eleven are expected to take a full course load which includes a nine period day allowing one period for lunch. Seniors must take a minimum of 5 ½ credits plus lunch. Students who challenge themselves do better and find school more interesting. Later in the spring you will receive a mailing containing the courses your child has selected for next year.

During the months of March and April, it is vital that our students establish a routine that will assist and guide them through the scholastic rigor that they will experience towards the end of the year. FRESHMEN FIRST NEWS

On **February 3, 2014,** the counselors began meeting with their <u>Freshmen</u> individually or in small groups to discuss course selection for the 2014-2015 school year. As they meet with their counselors, their **TENTATIVE** choices will be entered into the system. Please discuss with your child your expectations and what you consider to be appropriate choices. The Course Catalog for the 2014-2015 school year is available on the Counseling Department pages, in the Course Catalog tab. If you have any questions regarding the **process,** please contact your child's counselor. If you have questions regarding **academic placement**, please contact your child's teacher.

In March, the counselors will be introducing the Freshmen to the NAVIANCE program and administering a career inventory. This will help students to explore the relationship between their interests, school and possible career areas. The results of the inventory can be viewed at home with access to the NAVIANCE program.

SOPHOMORES

Counselors have been meeting with their own students individually during the fall semester to continue to develop a personal relationship. Topics discussed included, but were not limited to, their academic progress, interests and plans for the future.

Counselors met with the fall Health classes in December to review the NAVIANCE program and also administer the "Do What You Are" inventory. This will help students explore the relationship between their interests, school and possible career areas. The results of the inventory can be viewed at home with access to the NAVIANCE system. The counselors will meet with the spring Health classes sometime in March.

SENIORS

Seniors - Mid-year grades will go out to the colleges immediately after Report Cards are posted. If you have submitted a College Application on-line, do not forget to let your counselor know. Schools don't usually notify us that you have applied on-line; therefore, you must notify your counselor in order for us to send your mid-year grades to the colleges.

If you have not submitted any applications yet, please see your counselor **ASAP** to develop a plan for your post-high school life.

The Counseling Department would like to remind students who are planning to take SATs, SAT IIs or ACTs this spring of the upcoming deadlines for registration. Please contact your counselor to discuss what tests are appropriate for you.

Students should be aware that the College Board is requiring that students upload a picture to the College Board site when they register for the test and that they MUST bring a picture ID to the test. If you do not have a school ID, you should make sure you get one before the test date.

Science Olympiads "ISLIP SCI OLY INVITATIONAL"

On December 14th the Science Olympiad team held its first annual "Islip Sci Oly Invitational." The event was very successful due to the hard work of many different people. The team extends its praise to Mr. Christiansen and Dr. Quackenbush for all they did to make the invitational the success it was.

Twenty-one teams came to the event braving some very iffy weather. Students on these teams competed in twenty-six different events ranging from several building events such as Boomilever, Bungee Drop, Elastic Launch Glider, Mag. Lev, Mission Possible and Scrambler. The study events were Anatomy, Astronomy, Chemistry Lab, Chemistry of Food, Circuit Lab, Compound Machines Designer Genes, Disease Detective, Dynamic Planet, Entomology, Experimental Design, Forensics, Green Generation, Materials Science, Rocks and Minerals, Technical Problem Solving, Water Quality and Write it-Do-it. All of the events are an extension of what the students either learned in class and/or in their AP science courses.

The invitational was so successful because of the many volunteers from the community and support of local merchants such as Islip Meat Market, Flowers by Chazz, Lad and Lassie Precision Dog Grooming, Nattz Tattz and Tina's II Pizzeria, all of which sponsored the invitational.

NEWS FROM OUR ATHENS TRIP...

The Science Olympiad Team traveled to Athens, Pennsylvania on January 17 - 18 to compete with powerhouse

teams from Ohio, Virginia, New Jersey and other teams from New York. The competition consisted of 30 top teams from their states. Islip has been attending this competition for the last eight years, and the event has been an excellent motivation for our team to do well at our Regional Competition in New York State as well as preparation in attending the New York State Competition in March.

Catapult Team

Well, 2013 was the beginning of the second decade of existence, 11 years for the Islip High School Catapult Team. It is also the end for 7 of our seniors, several of whom began on the Middle School Team and continued all through High School making them the longest running tenured group of "Punkin Chunkers" this team has had. With this also came a lot of success, broken records and new achievements to be proud of.

In these last 4 years alone, the team has been crowned Grand Champion at the Long Island Championship Pumpkin Fling 3 out of 4 times, taking first place in the High School Division 3 out of 4 years, along with winning a third place trophy. By winning the High School Division at the Long Island Championship Pumpkin Fling, the team also earned the Perpetual Trophy that goes with it (8 out of the first 10 years). The first 10 year Perpetual Trophy is held by the winning team each year and then returned for the next competition. It has now been retired and is located in the Islip High School Catapult Team's trophy case after earning it the last year it was given out.

The team, in its first year, broke the Long Island record held by the previous Islip team at 814.2 feet with a new distance of 906.2 feet. After that achievement, their new goal was to break 1,000 feet shooting a 3-5 pound pumpkin which had never been done by a youth category according to the World Championship Punkin Chunkin records.

Always wanting to try something new, the team figured they would venture off Long Island last year for a different competition. What they did was not only set a new team record, but a new record at the "Last Fling Pumpkin Sling" in New Jersey. The team took first place in their category, whisking away the Grand Champion Trophy with them, by catapulting their pumpkin 1,014.9 feet. Their next target would be, once again, the annual Long Island Championship Pumpkin Fling hosted by Cornell Cooperative Extension of Suffolk at the Suffolk County Farm. With their first throw, the team landed a new Long Island Record, breaking their own team record that they set the week before, and unofficially breaking the World Record in their category with a throw of 1,045.9 feet. This throw garnered the team first place in the High School Division and overall Grand Champion, as well as landing them the Audience Favorite Award.

This year the team worked through much adversity with mechanical breakdowns, however, they did not get discouraged. Instead, the team rolled up their sleeves, found the tools and parts needed, and were able to make repairs in the field to continue to compete. This took skill and determination to keep things going and showed their metal. Once again, the team went to New Jersey entering the "Last Fling Pumpkin Sling" which attracted thousands to Harmony Township New Jersey over the course of this two-day event and included 26 other teams. The Islip High School Catapult Team and the machine which Islip has named Jack O Splatter, takes the "Catapult Power Added" honors with their longest shot of 983'.

Now in its fourth year, this fierce competition – where brain meets brawn – unites teams from across the region that gather to show off their pumpkin-slinging skills in hopes of being named Grand Champion.

The main attraction is students putting their physics, problem -solving and team-building skills to the test.

Next came the Long Island Championship Pumpkin Fling where they came home with a 3rd place trophy.

Catapult Team continued...

The final and most exciting competition was the "World Championship Punkin Chunkin" held in Delaware. The event was broadcast on the Science Channel Thanksgiving night. The Islip High School Catapult Team was the only youth team representing New York and the only team from Long Island. The national event garners competitors from all over the country from New Hampshire to North Carolina and westward to Oklahoma and Colorado. There was even a team from Australia participating.

The team had to forfeit their first throw on Friday as a day to travel to the event leaving only one throw each day on Saturday and Sunday. On Saturday, their division - Youth 11-17 Human Powered - was up early in the competition where they threw a respectable 940.12 feet. However, the angle of trajectory was very high, and the team knew that with some modifications, they could change things to increase their throwing distance. So, at the end of the competition on Saturday, the team took to their machine making the necessary changes, adjustments and repairs. In test fires that afternoon, they knew they were already increasing their distance.

On Sunday, the team was up early in the competition once again. But as has beset them all season, they hit more snags with something happening on the last and final try; the pumpkin exploding in mid-air due to the forces exerted upon it. That is what is called pie in this event. As per the official rules, the pumpkin must stay intact until reaching the ground. Even with only one official shot that would count towards the standing, the team captured third place for their division. The group gained the respect and camaraderie from other teams as they all watched Islip toil as a team and chip in to do something to make it all work. It was also not bad meeting TV celebrities from "Myth Busters" -Kari Byron, Tory Belleci, and Grant Imahara.

The team consists of seniors: Dan Angileri, Mike Barsalona, James Claudio, Brian Eichner, Mike Maratta, Sam Melaniff, and Joe Salerno; sophomores: Ryan Maziarz and Steven Walis, along with new freshman, Robert Phalen and Dylan Lima, along with 8th grader Kyle Maziarz stepping up to the team. The Team is coached by parent volunteer Ken Phalen.
