

The school year



is halfway over, students have completed midterms and report cards are posted on Infinite Campus. Please log in and check your child's report card and attendance. It is accessible 24 hours a day for your convenience. If you need further information on how to access this information, please call Michele Finlay at 650-8232. She will be happy to help you.

Students have registered for courses for next year. Discuss with your child course offerings. It is our expectation that students will sign up for rigorous courses that interest them. Students in grades nine through eleven are expected to take a full course load which includes a nine period day allowing one period for lunch. Seniors must take a minimum of 5 1/2 credits plus lunch. Students who challenge themselves do better and find school more interesting. Later in the spring you will receive a mailing containing the courses your child has selected for next year.

During the months of March and April, it is vital that our students establish a routine that will assist and guide them through the scholastic rigor that they will experience towards the end of the year. Please discuss your child's progress with him or her. If your child is failing or not doing as well as you expect, please call your child's teacher at 650-8300 or guidance at 650-8350 to discuss the situation. We are here to assist you and welcome communication.

While our emphasis is always upon the academic aspects of each day, we also have many other opportunities to offer our students in the areas of athletics and extracurricular activities. These athletic and extracurricular activities at the high school provide educational experiences that have tremendous value and enrich the high school experience.

You, the parents, are a critical part of our process of preparing your child for the future. Please assist us by sitting down with your child and discussing the importance of making the right decisions in school that will lead to future success in college and life in general. FRESHMEN FIRST NEWS

On January 23, 2012, the counselors began meeting with their **Freshmen** individually or in small groups to discuss course selection for the 2012-13 school year. As they meet with their counselor, their **TENTATIVE** choices will be entered into the system. Please discuss with your child your expectations and what you consider to be appropriate choices. The Course Catalog for the 2012-2013 school year is available on the Counseling Department pages, in the Course Catalog tab. If you have any questions regarding the **process**, please contact your child's counselor. If you have questions regarding **academic placement**, please contact your child's teacher.

In March the counselors will be introducing the Freshmen to the NAVIANCE program and administering a career inventory. This will help students to explore the relationship between their interests, school and possible career areas. The results of the inventory can be viewed at home with access to the NAVIANCE program.

Sophomores

Counselors have been meeting with their own students individually during the fall semester to continue to develop a personal relationship. Topics discussed included but were not limited to their academic progress, interests and plans for the future.

Counselors met with the fall Health classes in December to review the NAVIANCE program and also administer the Do What You Are inventory. This will help students explore the relationship between their interests, school and possible career areas. The results of the inventory can be viewed at home with access to the NAVIANCE system. The counselors will meet with the spring Health classes sometime in March.

Starting on 1/23/12 the counselors began meeting with their <u>Sophomores</u> to discuss tentative course requests for the next school year. Please discuss with your child what courses you consider appropriate for him or her. If you have any questions regarding the **process**, please contact your child's counselor. If you have not submitted any applications yet, please see your counselor **ASAP** to develop a plan for your post-high school life.

The Counseling Department would like to remind students who are planning to take SATs, SAT IIs or ACTs this spring, of the upcoming deadlines for registration. Please contact your counselor to discuss what tests are appropriate for you.

Sugar and Spice and not very nice.

What is the synthetic drug Spice? It is an "herbal incense" that is known as either Spice or K2. The incense mimics the hallucinogenic effects that occur when smoking traditional marijuana. Spice is sold in Suffolk County head shops, gas stations and smoke shops. It is important that parents of the Islip community know that this drug is available at our local gas stations and convenience stores in our neighborhood. You must be 19 to purchase Spice. Its product packaging states that it is not used for human consumption. It costs around \$20.00 for 1 gram and \$45.00 for 3 grams. This fake marijuana has caused increased calls to local poison control centers.

The adverse health effects associated with use include seizures, hallucinations, paranoid behavior, agitation, anxiety, and nausea, vomiting, racing heartbeat and elevated blood pressure.

The DEA considers Spice "A Drug of Concern". It is important for parents to discuss this synthetic drug and its dangerous effects with your child. It is important to seize any opportunity to talk with your child about this drug. The discussion can be during mealtime, while in the car, or during family time.

The Federal, State and local governmental agencies have, or are in the process of, banning this product to market.

The competition is an opportunity for science and engineering tech students to design, build and operate a sophisticated mechanical device. Teams come from all over Long Island to compete.

For an impressive sixth year in a row, the Islip High School Catapult Team captured the Pumpkin Flinger title for their division, held this year on November 12th at the Suffolk County Farm in Yaphank, New York. In addition to winning the first-place trophy, the team was also awarded the perpetual trophy, which is considered the "Stanley Cup" of pumpkin flinging. They did an excellent job and should be proud of their accomplishments.

The catapult, fondly named "Jack O' Splatter" was designed and constructed by members of Islip's Catapult Teams.
