

The school year



is halfway over, students have completed midterms and report cards are posted on Infinite Campus. Please log in and check your child's report card and attendance. It is accessible 24 hours a day for your convenience. If you need further information on how to access this information, please call Michele Finlay at 650-8232. She will be happy to help you.

Students have registered for courses for next year. Discuss with your child course offerings. It is our expectation that students will sign up for rigorous courses that interest them. Students in grades nine through eleven are expected to take a full course load which includes a nine period day allowing one period for lunch. Seniors must take a minimum of 5 1/2 credits plus lunch. Students who challenge themselves do better and find school more interesting. Later in the spring you will receive a mailing containing the courses your child has selected for next year.

During the months of March and April, it is vital that our students establish a routine that will assist and guide them through the scholastic rigor that they will experience towards the end of the year. Please discuss your child's progress with him or her. If your child is failing or not doing as well as you expect, please call your child's teacher at 650-8300 or guidance at 650-8350 to discuss the situation. These athletic and extracurricular activities at the high school provide educational experiences that have tremendous value and enrich the high school experience.

FRESHMEN FIRST NEWS

On January 28, 2013 the counselors began meeting with their <u>Freshmen</u> individually or in small groups to discuss course selection for the 2013-14 school year. As they meet with their counselors, their **TENTATIVE** choices will be entered into the system. Please discuss with your child your expectations and what you consider to be appropriate choices. The Course Catalog for the 2013-2014 school year is available on the Counseling Department pages, in the Course Catalog tab. If you have any questions regarding the **process**, please contact your child's counselor. If you have questions regarding **academic placement**, please contact your child's teacher.

In March, the counselors will be introducing the Freshmen to the NAVIANCE program and administering a career inventory. This will help students to explore the relationship between their interests, school and possible career areas. The results of the inventory can be viewed at home with access to the NAVIANCE program.

SOPHOMORES

Counselors have been meeting with their own students individually during the fall semester to continue to develop a personal relationship. Topics discussed included, but were not limited to, their academic progress, interests and plans for the future.

Counselors met with the fall Health classes in December to review the NAVIANCE program and also administer the "Do What You Are" inventory. This will help students explore the relationship between their interests, school and possible career areas. The results of the inventory can be viewed at home with access to the NAVIANCE system. The counselors will meet with the spring Health classes sometime in March.

SENIORS

Mid-year grades will go out to the colleges immediately after Report Cards are posted. If you have submitted a College Application on-line, do not forget to let your counselor know. Schools don't usually notify us that you have applied on-line; therefore, you must notify your counselor in order for us to send your mid-year grades to the colleges.

If you have not submitted any applications yet, please see your counselor **ASAP** to develop a plan for your posthigh school life.

The Counseling Department would like to remind students who are planning to take SATs, SAT IIs or ACTs this spring of the upcoming deadlines for registration. Please contact your counselor to discuss what tests are appropriate for you.

SAT/ACT Registration

Students should be aware that the College Board is requiring that students upload a picture to the College Board site when they register for the test and that they MUST bring a picture ID to the test. If you do not have a school ID, you should make sure you get one before the test date.

In 2011, the Lady Bucs won three road games as they entered the playoffs as the #5 seeded team defeating undefeated #1 seed Sayville in the semi final game and then winning the county title by defeating #2 seed Bayport Blue Point. History repeated itself once again as the Lady Bucs entered this year's playoffs as the #3 seed. The Lady Bucs however this time defeated #2 seed Bayport on the road before winning it's 7th County Championship in the past ten years defeating arch rival and #1 seed Sayville by a score of 2-1 in the County Championship. The Lady Bucs were then crowned Co-Long Island Champions, unfortunately falling to RVC/Southside on Penalty Kicks to determine who would progress to the final four. RVC would eventually win its 18th State Championship.



Additionally, the IVS Lady Bucs finished the season ranked #2 Team in NYS, #1 Class A Suffolk County Ranked Team by Newsday, #4 NSCAA Region II, as well as being ranked #19 NATIONALLY in the NSCAA National Rankings all season end. Although IVS has been ranked nationally in the past, this is the first time in school history that the Lady Bucs finished a season being ranked in the Top 25 National Rankings.



Pumpkin' Fling Honors

It was created by some good old problem solving with a dash of muscle thrown in. Put all together it's a recipe for learning, making students think outside the box (and classroom), setting new goals and achieving new heights in the process. In this case, the sky is the limit, literally by sending pumpkins soaring.

What is this team? The Islip High School Catapult Team. Never heard of it? Well, in these last ten years the team has won, been crowned Grand Champion at the Long Island Championship Pumpkin Fling numerous times, set several records and has won the High School Division and the perpetual trophy that goes with it, eight out of the last ten years. This year the perpetual trophy, which is held by the winning team each year then returned for the next competition, will be retired to the Islip High School Catapult Teams Trophy case along with several other trophies won this year.

What is the trend? First there was the High School Team. Since then came a Middle School Team and an Elementary level team from Local Cub Scout Pack 370 out of

Commack Road Elementary School.

Setting new goals? Well the team has set several records in the past and currently holds the Long Island Record at 906.2 feet. Being their 10th year, the new goal was to break 1,000 feet shooting a 3-5 pound pumpkin. On October 21st, the Team took their catapult, which is built upon a trailer (it is so big), and went off to their first competition in New Jersey. Always wanting to try something new, the team figured they would venture off Long Island for practice before the Long Island Championship. What they did was set a new team record, a new record at the New Jersey "Last Fling Pumpkin Sling" and whisked the Grand Champion Trophy back to New York with them by catapulting their pumpkin 1,014.9 feet. On the weekend of October 27, 2012 they were ready for any and all competition at Long Island Championship Pumpkin Fling hosted each year at Suffolk County Farm by Cornell Cooperative Extension of Suffolk. With just their first throw they landed a new Long Island Record, breaking their team record that they set the week before and unofficially breaking the World Record in their category with a throw of 1,045.9 feet. So the team took First Place in the High School Division and the overall Grand Champion as well as landing the Audience Favorite award. Following in that tradition, the Islip Middle School came in First Place in the Middle School Category and Cub Scout Pack 370 from Commack Road Elementary School came in third in their division as well as taking first in the accuracy competition.

What is the next goal? It is to make the World Record official and take first place at the "World Championship Punkin Chunkin" Competition in Delaware next year. This year's High School team consisted of Dan Angileri, Mike Barsalona, James Claudio, Brian Eichner, Mike Maratta, Ryan Maziarz, Sam Melaniff, Joe Salerno, Steven Walis and coached by parent volunteer Ken Phalen.

LEARNING ABOUT ISLIP VOLUNTEERS



Did you know that the average weight of a firefighter's gear is 80 to 100 pounds? The Islip High School Work Experience Program recently visited the Islip Fire Department to learn about the jobs of volunteer firefighters and EMTs. After a brisk walk through town with Mrs. Clock, the students toured the firehouse, learned about the different types of equipment used to fight fires, and watched the EMTs respond to a real ambulance call. The students learned about the qualifications and dedication needed to become a volunteer. We were happy to learn that six of the current probationary members are all Islip High School graduates

and ironically, former students of Mrs. Clock. Of course, the best part was going on the fire truck and trying on all the equipment the firefighters wear! Thank you Firefighter Gary for the tour!

DO YOU KNOW WHERE YOUR RECYCLABLES GO?

Well...now we do! Did you know that 300,000 households are serviced by the Town of Islip recycling program? Mrs. Clock's Work Experience Program visited the Town of Islip Recycling Center in Holbrook recently. The students were there on paper pick up day and got to see the recycling process from beginning to end. They also walked through the process of glass and plastic recycling, visited the segregating area, and learned about the household waste drop-off area. They learned that in the Town of Islip you can drop off your old batteries, TVs, electronics, household cleaners, propane tanks, and other debris right at the center,



which is located on Lincoln Avenue in Holbrook. Students learned about the different items you can make from recycled paper and will soon participate in a lesson from Ms. Wynn at the Town of Islip on how to make their own paper from recycled magazines and circulars.
