

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

The school year



is halfway over, students have completed midterms and report cards are posted on Infinite Campus. Please log in and check your child's report card and attendance. It is accessible 24 hours a day for your convenience. If you need further information on how to access this information, please call Michele Finlay at 650-8232. She will be happy to help you.

Students have registered for courses for next year. Discuss with your child course offerings. It is our expectation that students will sign up for rigorous courses that interest them. Students in grades nine through eleven are expected to take a full course load which includes a nine period day allowing one period for lunch. Seniors must take a minimum of 5 1/2 credits plus lunch. Students who challenge themselves do better and find school more interesting. Later in the spring you will receive a mailing containing the courses your child has selected for next year.

During the months of March and April, it is vital that our students establish a routine that will assist and guide them through the scholastic rigor that they will experience towards the end of the year. Please discuss your child's progress with him or her. If your child is failing or not doing as well as you expect, please call your child's teacher at 650-8300 or guidance at 650-8350 to discuss the situation. We are here to assist you and welcome communication.

While our emphasis is always upon the academic aspects of each day, we also have many other opportunities to offer our students in the areas of athletics and extracurricular activities. These athletic and extracurricular activities at the high school provide educational experiences that have tremendous value and enrich the high school experience.

You, the parents, are a critical part of our process of preparing your child for the future. Please assist us by sitting down with your child and discussing the importance of making the right decisions in school that will lead to future success in college and life in general. As always, I look forward to seeing many of you at the upcoming events that we hold at the high school.

The Islip Public Schools Office of Fine and Performing Arts is proud to announce the selection of eight students to perform in the Suffolk County Music Educators Association (SCMEA) All-County Festival.

FRESHMEN FIRST NEWS

On **January 18, 2011** the counselors will start meeting with their <u>Freshmen</u> individually or in small groups to discuss course selection for the 2011-2012 school year. When they meet with their counselor, their **TENTATIVE** choices will be entered into the system. Please discuss with your child your expectations and what you consider to be appropriate choices. The Course Catalog for the 2011-2012 school year is available on the Counseling Department pages, in the Course Catalog tab. If you have any questions regarding the **process** please contact your child's counselor. If you have questions regarding **academic placement**, please contact your child's teacher.

Sophomores

Counselors have been meeting with their own students individually during the fall semester to continue to develop a personal relationship. Topics discussed included but were not limited to their academic progress, interests and plans for the future.

Counselors met with the fall Health classes in October to review the NAVIANCE program and also administer the Do What You Are inventory. This will help students explore the relationship between their interests, school and possible career areas. The counselors will meet with the spring Health classes sometime in March.

Starting **January 18, 2011** the counselors will meet with their <u>Sophomores</u> to discuss tentative course requests for the next school year. Please discuss with your child what courses you consider appropriate for him or her. If you have any questions regarding the **process** please contact your child's counselor. <u>Juniors</u>

Meetings with the **Juniors** took place during the week of **January 10, 2011**, in order to review the score report from the PSAT and discuss ways to use their personal score report as a guide to improve SAT performance. The counselors also administered a College Interest Inventory and discussed the College Search & Selection process. These meetings closely followed the College Life 101 presentations on **January 6, 2011** where the Juniors heard from Islip alumni about their college search and application process.

We are respectfully requesting a \$25 donation from each senior family to help cover expenses.



Suffolk Zone Fitness Award



Two Islip High School students were honored at a dinner sponsored by the New York State Association of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance. Alex Gaviria and Paige Costantino were recognized at the Hyatt Regency on December 1st. The criteria for achievement for this award are: exceptional physical performance, scholastic ability, and outstanding character and leadership qualities.

Alex's physical education teacher ranks him one of the All-Time Best. Alex is a three year Varsity Athlete in Football, Basketball and Lacrosse who has maintained a 93 average. A New York State Scholar Athlete, he is a member of the National Honor Society and Junior Chamber of Commerce. Alex plans on studying Architecture and playing football in college and is undecided where he will continue his education in the fall.

Paige is a true leader in Physical Education class as she leads by example. Paige's positive attitude in class is contagious. Paige has maintained a 93 average while participating on the Varsity Soccer, Winter Track and La-

The Girl's Varsity Soccer Team once again accomplished several amazing feats this past fall season. The Lady Bucs finished in second place in the toughest league in Suffolk County with a winning record of 6-4-2 in league five having previously won ten consecutive league titles (A Suffolk County record). Islip was the only team to defeat Deer Park who finished first in the league with an 11-1-0 record. Having won its first two playoff games by a score of 3-0, the Islip Lady Bucs returned to the county championship game, its sixth appearance in nine years. Although the Lady Bucs were finally defeated in a championship game, their dedication, spirit and compassion did not go unnoticed. Islip once again received more accolades and individual honors than any other Suffolk team. Sophomore Shannon McKenna was selected to the All-League Team, Sophomore Alex Peluso and Tori D'Acunto were selected to the All-Conference Team along with senior Tara Bernocco. Sophomore Amanda Buck along with senior captains Paige Costantino and Katie Hyland were selected to the All-County Team. Captain Katie Hyland was also named the Small Schools Player of the Year for the second consecutive year. Recently, both Paige Costantino and Katie Hyland were also selected to the All-State Team respectively. Katie Hyland, who has committed and accepted a very nice scholarship to James Madison University, was also named to the Newsday All-Long Island Team for the second consecutive year as well as selected to the NSCAA-Adidas All Region Team and was an All-American nominee. Coach Reilly in his nine year tenure with the team has accumulated eight League titles and five County Championships with six appearances along with an overall record of 117 wins with 27 losses and 9 ties. Coach Reilly has also taken over the reigns for Suffolk County as both the coordinator and coach of the Suffolk Girls Exceptional Senior Game Teams. Seniors Tara Bernocco and Chelsea Rosenthal were selected to the Suffolk County Exceptional Senior Team. Suffolk competed against Nassau's finest in late November. Both teams from Suffolk defeated both Nassau teams by a score of 1-0 and 3-0 in a great event attended by friends, family, fans, the local community, not to mention the numerous colleges in attendance scouting the games looking for that special student athlete.
