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

Senior Reminder

All colleges to which you have applied were sent a copy of your mid-year grades. These were mailed out following the mailing home. Speak to your counselor if there are items on the report card that you feel need to be either explained or highlighted for the colleges. This is the time to make that final pitch to the college of your choice if you have not heard from them yet. The counselors would love to be able to help you contact the admissions office and express your interest.

You should have already filed the FAFSA. If you have not already done so, you should complete it as soon as possible. The FAFSA form is available on line at <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>. Even if you qualify for aid, if you submit the information past the colleges' deadline you may not get any aid, so DO NOT DELAY. 
